Confirm travel arrangements to and from your departure and return cities. Verify with our

office that your trip has met minimum numbers prior to booking flights.

Reserve overnight lodging for the night prior to your trip, if applicable. You may also wish to reserve a room for the night that you return from the river. It is important to make reservations early, as rooms may be limited during peak travel periods. If you would like us to reserve lodging for you, let us know. **Lodging is included in Luxury Expeditions.**

Final payment is due in our office 45 days prior to your trip (refer to your invoice for final payment date). Please let us know if you would like us to automatically charge your credit card on file when final payment is due.

Moab is full of really great recreational activities. Our staff play in Moab a lot, and are happy to share our ideas and assist you in planning and arranging additional activities for while you are here.

What IS Included?

- **SKILLED, PROFESSIONAL AND FUN GUIDES**: some of the best in the business. Our guides are trained in the art of river running; all of our guides have Emergency Medical Response and CPR certification, as well as hours of river rescue and river specific training.
- FULL DAY ON THE RIVER: We begin early the first day and return the last day at day's end.
- ALL RAFTING and SAFETY EQUIPMENT: Rafts & related equipment, personal flotation devices
 (PFDs), safety equipment, sleeping bag, sleeping pad, tent, personal dry bags for your gear, kitchen,
 dining & toilet equipment.
- ALL MEALS: Beginning with lunch the first day through lunch the last day. Our menus are healthy and creative, and are prepared fresh daily by your guides. Many of our fruits and vegetables are locally sourced. Dinners always begin with hors d'oeuvres. Breakfast and lunch are equally tasty with varieties of foods to choose from. Every meal is balanced and there is always plenty. We can accommodate most diets and food restrictions with advanced notice.
- **ORIENTATION:** The day before your trip we will meet at 5:00 PM at the Sheri Griffith Expeditions office for a pre-trip meeting. Your trip leader will provide a thorough trip orientation and pass out your waterproof bags so that you can pack your belongings that evening. The trip leader will also reconfirm the meeting time for the following morning and give you an opportunity to ask any last-minute questions. Please call our office if you will not be able to attend the orientation so that we can provide the information to you with an alternate method.
- TRANSPORTATION: Most of our trips meet at and return to our office in Moab. We provide transportation to and from the River on these trips. Our rafting trips in Desolation Canyon and Cataract Canyon include scenic flights. The scenic flight is limited by the FAA to 25 pounds of luggage per person. Our Desolation Canyon trips meet at the Moab Airport on the morning of departure. You can leave your car at the airport while you are on the river (\$3 per day parking fee). Only keys can be left with the Red Tail Aviation Staff on the morning of departure. Please contact us with questions about other valuables. Please arrive at the airport at least 30 minutes before your scheduled flight.
- BEVERAGES: Iced water, Gatorade, lemonade, and iced tea powders are provided. Soda, coffee, hot tea and cocoa are provided in camp. There is also an iced cooler available for additional beverages you may wish to bring, i.e. beer, wine and soda. (Beverages can be pre-ordered using our Optional Beverage Order Form and will be loaded on the boats for you.)

What is NOT Included?

- TRANSPORTATION TO MOAB AND OUR OFFICE
- **LODGING IN MOAB:** unless you have reserved one of our Luxury Expeditions or have requested that we book lodging for you.
- **GRATUITIES:** always appreciated by our guides(15-20% of your trip price is the suggested gratuity)
- PERSONAL ITEMS: including sunscreen, chapstick and bug spray to name a few. Please refer to the packing list.

Getting to Moab

Moab, Utah, is located on Highway 191 about 30 miles south of Interstate 70. It is approximately a two hour drive from Grand Junction, Colorado and a four hour drive from Salt Lake City. Both cities have commercial airports with rental cars and vans as well as shuttle companies. Direct flights into Moab are offered by SkyWest (United) out of Denver, Colorado. Please check with our office for the most up-to-date information on these services. If you are driving to Moab or renting a vehicle upon arrival in Moab, you may park in our locked, gated property adjacent to our office while you are on the river.

The area is a paradise for outdoor enthusiasts as well as a geological wonderland. The town of Moab is nestled in a valley with the 12,000 foot La Sal Mountains on one end and the mighty Colorado River on the other. All of this is surrounded by 1,000 foot red rock cliffs and breathtaking, rugged desert terrain.

Multi-Day River Trip Orientation

The day before your rafting trip departure, we will meet at **5:00 PM** at the **Sheri Griffith Expeditions office** (**2231 South Highway 191 Moab Utah**, 84532) for a pre-trip meeting. Your trip leader will provide a thorough trip orientation and pass out your dry-bags so that you can pack your belongings that evening. The trip leader will also reconfirm the meeting time for the following morning and give you an opportunity to ask any last-minute questions. Please arrive at least 5 minutes before the departure time listed on your invoice. If you are unable to attend this orientation, please contact our office as soon as possible to make alternative arrangements to collect the vital information about your trip.

Moab Weather

You can expect warm, sunny, delightful days in Southeastern Utah. In April through May, high temperatures range between 70° and 90°. June, July and August high temperatures typically range between 90° and 100°, with September and October temperatures ranging between 70° and 80°. The climate here is very dry with little humidity. Summer evenings are quite comfortable though spring and fall evenings can be cool. Other than an occasional rain cloud, there are few overcast days, however, **always pack your raingear!** No matter the weather, you will find your visit to be fascinating and unforgettable.

How to Pack

Packing for a rafting trip is easier than you might think! For mid-summer trips, We suggest packing lightweight clothing that can be worn in layers and one light sweater or fleece jacket for cool evenings and mornings. For early or late season trips (March –May and September—October) we suggest warmer clothing. Dress standards on the river are always casual, and most of the restaurants and other businesses in Moab are fine with casual dress.

It is especially important that you pack clothing that you do not mind getting wet. Synthetic fabrics have the advantage of being quick to dry because they don't retain water. Pile and fleece made of polyester or nylon work well as insulation. Cotton sweatshirts and jeans are not recommended as river wear as they are usually made of heavier fabric and take a long time to dry when wet. Also, because our rivers are very silty, we advise against bringing white clothing that you do not want to have permanently dyed red.

If you wear prescription glasses or contact lenses, we recommend that you bring an extra pair. A strap for your glasses is essential. If your wear contact lenses, wraparound sunglasses are recommended, as are goggles during the rapids.

We do have a small store on site that carries last minute items like sunscreen, biodegradable soap, bug spray, chapstick, water bottles, sarongs, river shirts, rain gear, hats and souvenirs.

We will provide wetsuits and splash gear when conditions require them or upon advanced request.

Waterproof Bags:

We provide two waterproof bags at the river trip orientation. The first is a larger 20" x 20" x 27" bag that will be for clothing and your sleeping bag. This bag is tucked away each morning and unavailable until we pull over to camp each night. We suggest packing your clothing in a medium sized duffle bag for easier access each evening. The second bag is a "ditty" bag that measures about 9" x 20". This will be available to you all day, and should hold your day use items such as sunscreen, chapstick, extra snacks and rain gear. Please try to keep your bags under 25 pounds due to FAA regulations.

Handy Items:

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Ziplock and Trash Bags	Useful for separating personal items such as medications, shampoo, soap, wet items and dirty laundry.	Extra Snacks	We provide snacks throughout the day, but it is a good idea to bring extra snacks for children, for individuals who have snack preferences, or for those who are diabetic.
Wet Wipes	Great for washing your face, wiping your hands and cleaning dirt and sand off of personal items.	Rain Gear	Rain Gear isn't just for rain. When riding through the rapids, rain gear can provide extra protection and warmth when being splashed by cold water.
Carabiners	Very handy in the outdoors as well as back home. Their oval shape and simple gate mechanism allow you to easily clip your water bottle, camera, hat ~ just about anything ~ nearby.	Beverages	There is an ice cooler for "personal" drinks such as soda, juice, beer, wine, etc. Since there are no stores along the river, we recommend bringing more than you anticipate needing. Please do not bring glass. SGE provides water, available to you all day long, with lemonade, Gatorade, and iced tea mixes. We also provide 2 sodas per person, per day.

Dress Up Night?

Traditionally, the last night of a multi-day trip is a "Dress Up" night. Anything goes, from formal wear to clown outfits with floppy hats. Guests are not required to participate, but are welcome to use their imagination and help celebrate an amazing trip.

What About My Car and Other Valuables?

We have a locked and gated facility for your vehicles while you are on the river. We recommend that you leave your valuables at home. For personal items such as wallets, purses, keys, and cell phones, we have a secure storage area for your belongings while you are on the river. We can also store extra luggage in our secure storage area if needed.

DESOLATION CANYON TRIPS leave from the Moab airport. Please DO NOT plan to leave any valuables with the staff at the Moab airport as they do not have anywhere to store items securely. You may leave car keys with them, but all other luggage and valuables should be locked in your car. Please contact our office with questions about what to do with your luggage if you are not renting/using a car.

What Else Do I Need to Know?

Moab Stores	The grocery stores are open late so you can pick up any last minute items you may have forgotten. The state liquor store is open from 11 AM to 9 PM in the summer (May through October). The bookstores in town carry an excellent assortment of books about the rivers and the Colorado Plateau. For more information visit www.moabhappenings.com/shopping.htm .
Moab Restaurants	There are numerous restaurants in Moab to choose from that accommodate various culinary tastes. Most are open late in the evening though few are open early in the morning. Our guest services staff can help assist you with what restaurants are closest to your hotel. Moab Time Zone	Utah operates on Mountain Standard Time, with Daylight Savings Time in the Summer. Las Vegas is 1 hour behind Moab, as is the Grand Canyon and all of Arizona during the summer.
River Camping	The private camps in which you'll stay are mobile-tented river camps that your guides and you will set up each evening. Each day before we depart, the entire camp is broken down and the campsite returns to untenanted wilderness again. We provide top quality tents that sleep two persons comfortably. The tents used on the rafting programs are quite roomy (7' x 8' x 5'). To keep tents cool and airy there are two "doors" and a mesh, open top with a nylon rain fly. We also provide comfortable sleeping bags and pads. Sleeping bags are cozy and professionally laundered prior to each trip. Pillows are not included.
Food And Drink	Riverside meals, prepared by your guides, are delicious and varied. Meals are served buffet style. You may bring your own beer, wine or liquor and we will be happy to store it and keep it chilled. Please avoid bringing glass. Bring beer in aluminium cans and transfer hard liquor into plastic containers. Please remember that we are in remote areas, usually in a mixed group, and far from medical assistance. We trust our guests will not endanger themselves, offend others, or evoke a guides' intervention by over drinking. If you have a special dietary requirement, please advise Sheri Griffith Expeditions of your needs at least three weeks prior to departure. Every effort will be made to comply with your request.



In camp, there are shared bathroom facilities for men and women. Due to environmental impact issues, bathing facilities are limited to areas in, or directly adjacent to the river. If you choose to bring your own soap/shampoo, we suggest they be biodegradable products.

Sanitary facilities throughout the American West need to be in compliance with the strict standards set by the land management agencies and local, state, and federal guidelines. We provide top of the line portable toilets that offer privacy and are designed to be stable and comfortable. The most widely used system is a sealed container with a regular toilet seat attached. Hand washing stations will always be located near toilet and dining areas and all guests are encouraged to use them regularly.



There is no electrical power in the pitched camps along the rivers. It is suggested that you carry a supply of additional batteries for your camera and any battery-operated appliances you are taking along. Mechanical or electronic devices that are noisy and which may disturb other guests "wilderness experience" are discouraged. If you need a power source for a medical reason (i.e. a CPAP machine), please contact our office as soon as possible to discuss options. Drones are NOT allowed on our rafting trips.



You will be visiting some of the most remote areas of the United States, you should be aware that radio contact is <u>not often</u> possible while travelling in river canyons. Additionally, cellular phones do not operate in river canyons. We do carry Satellite phones and/or InReach Devices for emergencies, but they are ONLY for emergency use. Even our satellite phones are not guaranteed to have service in all areas.



Water Levels

The flow of the Colorado River and the Green River is generally unregulated. The river can reach flows considered extreme during spring runoff in years when the high country feeding the watershed has received a plentiful snowpack. Peak runoff usually occurs between mid-May and mid-June, but can vary widely from early May and into July. High water trips equate to a more intense whitewater experience and a high level of physical fitness is recommended. Water temperatures are coldest during the high water period and rain gear and warm synthetic clothing will be required. Wetsuits are always available upon advance request.



Generally, when travelling, you'll want to bring extra memory cards and batteries and any other equipment you will need.

Bring a protective sports pouch to protect your camera from water and sand. (We have these available in our store.) Participants will be able to store cameras in a shared drybag. If you are bringing a variety of lenses, please have a waterproof container of your own. We suggest a Pelican brand case. Keep in mind we cannot take responsibility for the safety of your personal property. An old river adage is "don't bring it on a river unless you can afford to lose it." Waterproof/disposable cameras are a great idea.

Sheri Griffith Expeditions may send a camera with the guides to photograph the trip. A link to purchase photos will be sent within 2 weeks.

Gratuities

Our guests often ask whether gratuities are appropriate, and in what amount. If you feel your guides have provided a very special trip for you, a gratuity may be left with the trip leader and will be shared among the crew.

Entirely discretionary, anything between 15% and 20% of the trip cost is a general tipping guideline. If you plan to tip, remember to bring a personal check or cash—ATMs are hard to find in the backcountry.

PLEASE, do not make out checks to Sheri Griffith Expeditions. If you are writing check please make it out to the Trip Leader. Credit Card gratuities are also welcome.

Additional Activities

Moab is an outdoor playground! If you would like more information about things to do in Moab, please feel free to call our office at **800-332-2439** and ask our friendly staff for more details about additional activities that are available before or after your rafting trip. Hummer Tours, ATV Tours, ZipLine, Horseback Rides, Mountain Bike Tours, Hiking, Canyoneering, Museums and Skydiving are just a few of the activities that are available in and around Moab.

OUTDOOR PERSONAL HYGIENE FOR WOMEN

Most of our river trips have female guides on them, and they are available to answer your questions. Our male guides are educated about menstrual cycles and urination differences, and are quite comfortable addressing your concerns. Sometimes, though, they need to be reminded that you may need more "stops" than they might have anticipated.

We carry sanitary porta-potties that are placed in a private area out of sight at the edge of camp. Because of space limitations, handling and weight considerations, porta-potties are used for solid waste only. If you need the porta-potty during the day, ask your guide to set it up. (In certain situations, they may offer different instructions for disposal.) Urination is only acceptable in the wet sand next to the river or in the river itself. The water flows offer continual cleansing and sanitizing of the river and beach areas.

If you are on or expecting your period please bring:

- 1. plenty of small ziplock bags
- 2. some extra toilet paper
- 3. Please dispose of your used napkins/tampons in your ziplock bag and then in the evening dispose of your ziplock baggie in the receptacle next to the porta-potty (not in the porta-potty)
- 4. Keep plenty of extra pads/tampons with your small ziplocks in your daypack at all times during your period.

A helpful hint from past guests--wearing a comfy, wrap-around sarong makes urination much easier because you don't have to pull down your pants. You can wear it over your swimsuit during the day or in the evenings to wash up. Packing a couple of sarongs can be helpful ie: a sun cover (a wet sarong is wonderful in the heat of the day), a skirt or sundress during in the evening or a beautiful beginning to a costume for the last nights party.

Wet Wipes are great to bring on any outdoor expedition but disposing of them can be a problem, if you bring them, please do not depose of them in the porta-potty, please put them in the garbage in the evenings.

The initial DEPOSIT is non-refundable. (This includes cancellation of the river trip, lodging and shuttle reservations.) Since you have reserved space for which we have a limited number of seats, our non-refundable policy applies in every instance. There are no exceptions for any reason, so we highly recommend that you purchase Travel Insurance to protect your vacation investment. SAFETY, ASSUMPTION OF RISK AND INSURANCE

Safety is our number one priority. However, all outdoor experiences involve risk and we all must recognize that accidents or illnesses may occur. We cannot guarantee your safety. We place final responsibility for your safety firmly on your shoulders where it belongs. You have to pay attention to what you are doing. Mother Nature controls the water level, the weather and the elements, so there is a risk involved in rafting and camping. Before your trip departs, you will be asked to sign an Assumption of Risk and Release Form. If you have questions regarding this document or would like to request an additional copy, please contact our office. We assume no responsibility for injury to trip members, their personal belongings or, for time and expense incurred. We strongly recommend Travel Insurance, which covers vacation losses and accidents and provides a refund if you have to cancel your trip.

NON-PERFORMANCE

We make every effort to follow through on our plans. However, we reserve the right to make changes in the itinerary or possibly cancel a trip if necessary including but not limited to weather conditions, water fluctuations, insufficient reservations, changes in international relations, or other factors beyond our control. If cancellation is necessary, your money will be refunded. Our financial liability shall be limited to the amount actually paid and shall not be extended to cover any other costs incurred by the trip member.

HEALTH ISSUES

If you are of an adventurous spirit and in reasonably good health, you should have no problem enjoying any of our trips. It's not necessary to be an athlete to participate in a river expedition. However, It is several hours to the nearest medical center. If you take medication you should bring a good supply and inform your guide of all medication that you are taking. When you meet your guide, you should discretely explain any medical conditions you may have or be concerned about including allergies to bee stings, etc. Each guide carries a first aid kit and will need to know if specific medicines should be stored. It's also helpful to know about other health issues when planning activities for the day. **Pregnant women and anyone with heart trouble** should have their physician's approval before taking a river trip. If you have concerns about your suitability for this trip, please consult your physician.
